Breastfeeding Kits

As part of a Contribution Agreement with the GNWT Health and Social Services, MBB developed and distributed Breastfeeding Resource Kits to all the Community Health Representatives (CHRs) around the NWT. The intent of the kits is to aid the CHRs in promoting breastfeeding within their communities. Various written material and breastfeeding support products, such as breastfeeding pillows, breast pads, and nursing bras were included in the kits. These will be kept with the CHRs, and moms who want additional support and information on breastfeeding will be able to access this resource.

MBB will also be hosting a webinar with the CHRs and Public Health to review the products in the kits to increase the confidence of CHRs in promoting breastfeeding in their communities.

We are excited to have participated in this important campaign in promoting breastfeeding around the territory!
